With a holistic view the new lessons will fill a muchneeded gap that will enable the children to transition into formal education or work towards gainful employment.

Our small, passionate, hardworking team have been a lifeline to so many during the periods of harsh lockdown. Our deepest desire is to serve the marginalized and those that are forgotten - it is the very heartbeat of all we do. Thank you to our team, to the Open Schools Worldwide Board members and to the greater TeachBeyond family for keeping the flame of hope burning and for your unselfish commitment to see these precious ones served.



Our most profound and sincerest thank you to our faithful and generous supporters. We receive every donation with gratitude as we know it comes from the hand of God. We especially appreciate your kindness as the last few months have been challenging for most households. As a testament to the generous Open Schools Worldwide family in what has been a difficult financial year, our annual global fundraiser 'Kilometer's for Kids' raised double the funds given in 2020.

GIVING HOPE THROUGH PARTNERSHIPS

Open Schools Worldwide is a Christ-centered, biblically-based organization that is committed to facilitating non-traditional, educational interventions for marginalized children so that they may...

- Experience God's love and compassion, understanding that they are made in God's image having worth and value
- Recognize that they can learn
- Be equipped for current and future educational opportunities
- Learn life skills to address emotional and social needs
- Experience Hope

At Open Schools Worldwide we respond to the educational needs of children who are shut out of the traditional school systems for reasons beyond their control.

We value partnerships with likeminded organizations to deliver literacy, numeracy and life skills through trained Christian tutors that develop compassionate relationships and supportive environments to overcome learning obstacles. We work to facilitate flexible and innovative strategies that are unique to the needs of the children we serve.

OUR 4 STEP PROCESS

Step 1

PARTNER

We partner with Christian community organizations, NGOs, and Christian Schools

Step 2



IDENTIFY

The partner identifies project information (needs and resources), as well as Christian community leaders and volunteer tutors.

Step 3
TRAIN



We train and empower local tutors and volunteers.

Step 4
TEACH

The tutors and volunteers teach the children basic literacy, numeracy and life skills.

BRAZIL - HOPE OF EXPANSION

Most children in Brazil have access to school and yet many are faced with educational challenges and inequalities. The expectation is that children will be fully literate by the end of Grade 3. However, many are still not learning. As children advance to the subsequent grades without a strong foundation in literacy, the problems escalate. In 2018, 29 percent of teens over the age of 15 were functionally illiterate. They have difficulty in understanding even what a simple text means and making basic numeracy operations. Considering that due to the pandemic, schools were closed for 40 weeks during 2021 in some parts of the country, the situation has deteriorated further. For the past year and a half, a small, but highly committed team of Brazilian volunteers has been working on an adaptation of the Open Schools Worldwide curriculum into Portuguese. The style and structure of the lessons have been preserved but the order has been rearranged with the stories, questions, and ministry opportunities rewritten to fit the Brazilian context. With great hope and expectancy, we launch Open Schools Worldwide Brazil knowing that this pattern of discipleship will be used for Kingdom impact and growth.

ETHIOPIA - HOPE RESTORED

Open Schools Worldwide has been impacting the Korah community for the past 3 years, bringing sustained hope to the children attending the program in collaboration with TeachBeyond's Beyond Borders. Here are the highlights from 2021:

- Five children from the Korah 1 project have transitioned into formal schooling at the Kore Birhane Wongel Christian school, after spending 2 years on the Open Schools Worldwide program.
- Despite the lockdown of schools, the government allowed the Korah school programs to continue; they viewed these programs as essential since they fed the children two meals a day.
- The Korah 1 project moved to a new building where the children enjoy a larger classroom and play area.
- A new Korah 3 school program was launched, filling to capacity.

- An apprenticeship program began for teenagers in the Korah school program offering skills in jewellery making, haircutting, sewing, cooking and baking.
- Older school learners benefitted from a mentoring and Bible study program.
- The children continue to be discipled while learning Amharic, English, numeracy, and social skills through creative play.

Abeje started the Korah 1 school program at the age of 13. Prior to coming to Korah, he lived in the countryside as a shepherd boy. Homeless, working the trash dump, and unable to read or write, he was invited to join the school program. Given the opportunity to gain experience, he joined the Open Schools Worldwide/Beyond Borders program and soon became part of the barber apprenticeship training and the weekly Bible study. Abeje joined four other students after two years in the Korah 1 program and is transitioning to formal education at the local private Christian school. Abeje is one of many learners that the ministry of Open Schools Worldwide impacts with hope.

KENYA: HOPE IN THE MUKURU SLUMS

With the assistance of eleven tutors, 77 children were introduced to the Open Schools Worldwide program in the Mukuru slums in Nairobi.

A STORY OF HOPE IN KENYA: Melvin comes from a family where her parents divorced when she was young. She faced continuous school disruptions, losing hope in a prosperous future. As she joined the Open Schools Worldwide program in the Mukuru slums, her tutor encouraged her to trust in the Lord and not to lose hope. Engaging in the program helped Melvin get back on track with her learning. After a short time in the program, Melvin enrolled in the Kenya Certificate Primary Examinations and received the joyful news that she was accepted into a school. Melvin testifies that she believes that God opened doors for her, providing the school fees she needed for 2022. Her dream is to attend University in the years to come. Open Schools Worldwide has given her hope and the ability to see a bright future.

SOUTH AFRICA: HOPE FOR COMMUNITIES

The Open Schools Worldwide program was utilised to help learners who had been impacted by rotational learning brought on by the pandemic restrictions. Despite a year of disrupted learning, 97 volunteers tutored 753 children in the 34 projects in South Africa. A highlight this year was exposing 20 intern students from the 'More than a Teacher' (MTAT) holistic teacher development program to our Open Schools Worldwide curriculum. Based on the principles of transformational learning, the MTAT program which included the Open Schools Worldwide Literacy training, is designed to equip teacher interns with tools for their professional, personal and spiritual growth.

MARTHA'S STORY OF REBUILDING

Martha was among the thousands in South Africa who had lost their jobs in 2020 due to the pandemic. It was at that time that she volunteered for the Open Schools Worldwide training. "The training changed me. It touched me on a personal level, particularly during the Route 86:11 board game. I couldn't finish the game. It became very personal and challenged me. It helped me find myself by understanding that there is a reason why we go through trials in life. It was a gift from God that ended with me wanting to be part of the program," she shared.

The **Route 86:11** game is based on Psalm 86:11. 'Teach me your way, Lord, that I may rely on your faithfulness; give me an undivided heart, that I may fear your name. After the training, Martha reached out to others for help. Martha regained self-confidence and received counseling which improved her spiritual life, giving her the strength to restore broken relationships. Martha's dream is to give back to the community. As someone who narrowly missed being married off as a child, she wants to open her own non-profit organization where she can help children who are marginalized and vulnerable, orphans, and victims of child marriage. 'I blamed God for everything, without realizing that He gives and He takes away. He opened my eyes and put me on a new path where I can engage with more people. He changed my life for the better!'

ZAMBIA - HOPE REALIZED

Zambia is a country that struggles with providing education for many of the children. Often the distance to school requires children to rise early and walk long distances. This creates a barrier with many learners either not starting school or dropping out before they reach a literacy proficiency that will allow them to flourish as adults. Open Schools Worldwide operates projects in Lusaka and Livingstone. The children meet in informal classrooms, often in grass thatch shelters close to their homes with committed tutors that share not only literacy and numeracy skills but their very hearts. These projects are flourishing. Many children that would be without schooling are being reached through our biblically based program.





EUNICE'S STORY OF HOPE:

Eunice Nyambe

Project in Livingstone

Eunice Nyambe was one of the first volunteers trained in 2016 as an Open Schools Worldwide tutor. She had always dreamed of helping the children in her community of Ngwenya. Through prayer and conviction, she stepped out, speaking to those she met and telling of her need to have a place to start the Open Schools Worldwide program. A friend opened her home and Eunice started the program with 58 students. Eunice's enthusiasm and success has rippled into other communities hearing of her success with the Open Schools Worldwide program. She has trained others and replicated Open Schools Worldwide projects in Ngwenya and Zimba. Eunice notes, "We have seen changes in the volunteers after a few weeks of helping in the project. They have improved their own literacy and numeracy skills and grown in lesson planning. They have developed a deep concern for the children's spiritual, emotional, intellectual, and physical needs. Some of the tutors have found new purpose with their Open Schools Worldwide project. Parents are amazed at what we accomplish with the children and appreciate the work that we are doing. Sometimes I do not feel well, but I still have parents that plead with me to help their children with extra lessons, so I do."

Eunice speaks of her own transformation through her time serving with Open Schools Worldwide. She always had a God-given dream of helping orphans and vulnerable children. The training she received gave her the tools to step into her calling impacting not only the children but the community. She says, "Open Schools Worldwide has helped bring out the best in me. I didn't know of my potential to mobilize and lead until I started this project."





MALAWI: HOPE BECOMES A REALITY

Our desire to place 'A workbook in every child's hand' became a reality when we delivered 3000 workbooks to the children at all the centres in the Chikwawa District. We watched the reactions of the children with joy as they held their own book for the first time. Personal protective clothing was a challenge for this marginalized district who could not afford masks. To assist them and to keep the children protected during a pandemic, we solicited the sewing skills of a local tailor to make 2000 masks for the children so that they could attend the projects safely.



This event, along with presentations in churches, personal connections and foundations, generated promising funds to help resource the ever-increasing projects that Open Schools Worldwide is engaged in.


